

Property Committee Update

Next week, the engineering survey to determine the causes of leaking in our steeple will finally launch. Scaffolding will be erected on all sides of the tower on Tuesday, to be in place for approximately one month. Engineers and masons will be examining the tower with the goal of remediating the water leaks, and will perform a general inspection of the whole building. We do still have a bit of leaking in the basement of the parish hall, which will be an additional focus.

Financial Update

As we head back into the program year, our stewardship team thought it might be helpful to provide a snapshot of our financial picture here at St. Paul's. Despite the ongoing obstacles presented by COVID-19 and its variants, our leadership and our parish community have continued finding ways to come together for worship and communion, and to keep us connected through challenging times. In the same spirit, our people have rallied to continue making financial contributions despite the alterations to our routines that have prevented us from passing the plate along the pews each Sunday.

August was a tremendous month of generosity, for which we are enormously grateful. St. Paul's received \$30,500 in total giving, of which \$27,500 was pledge payments and \$3,000 was received in gifts. This has helped us to make significant progress towards our giving goals.

Our overall stewardship goal for this year is \$337,000, which is level with the our goal from 2020. This is a combined total for pledges and gifts. While we are making good progress on our pledge payments, our gift receipts are lower than in years past, due at least in part to the extended months of closure of the physical church. We are hopeful that being able to return to our beloved church will remind each of us exactly why this place and this community is so important to us, and will inspire us to continue supporting it with our time, our talent, and our treasure.


